Ages 16.9 months up to 18 years old are accepted into the program. Students attend Math, English, Science and Social Studies classes for 4.5 hours/day, 4-5 days/week. Also do team building activities like blood drives, bike rides, repelling, etc. Attendees are required to complete 40 hours of service to the community to graduate.
