SCHOOL-TO-WORK

The Board of Education shall provide a school-to-work program for elementary and secondary students that has been developed in accordance with state guidelines and has been approved by the State Superintendent of Public Instruction.

All students shall have access to a school-to-work program that provides for the following:

1. Practical application of basic skills in the general and vocational curricula;
2. Community field experiences in grades seven through 12, and in grades 11 and 12, school-supervised work experiences;
3. Career exploration and planning that also addresses sex-role stereotyping and gender equity as part of career decisionmaking;
4. Employability skills and attitudes;
5. Study of the practical application of economics and American economic institutions; and
6. In grades nine through 12, vocational education programs that have an appropriate curriculum based on labor market information including follow-up studies of graduates, job placement and employment needs.

The District Administrator or designee shall coordinate the school-to-work program in accordance with state laws and regulations. School-to-work program records shall be maintained and reports shall be made as required by the Department of Public Instruction.

The district may participate in a school-to-work consortium.
