SERIES 400 STUDENTS

FULL-TIME STUDENTS

In order to be considered as a full-time student, a student must meet at least one of the following definitions:

- 1. A middle or high school student who is enrolled in a minimum of four classes, one of which may be physical education.
- 2. An elementary school student who is enrolled in a full-day course of study.

The following are exceptions to the above and students attending school under these exceptions are considered full-time students.

- 1. A student with disabilities who has less than a minimum program as prescribed by his/her individualized education program (IEP) or is attending a center which adheres to a schedule in variance with the school day schedule of Marshall Public Schools.
- 2. A student who is involved in a(n) school-approved and/or -supervised work experience program and who has a minimum program equivalent.
- 3. A student who is involved in a special academic, off-campus or alternative educational program or curriculum or program modification.
- 4. A district resident who is attending a school in another public school district on a fulltime basis under the state's public school open enrollment program.

A student not meeting any of the above definitions may, with approval of the Board, be considered full-time.
