STUDENT HEALTH, SAFETY AND WELFARE

The Marshall Board of Education recognizes the need to maintain a continuing interest in the health, safety and welfare of the students in its charge while they are at school or at a school-approved instructional or extracurricular activity whether held on or off school premises. Therefore, the district shall, at a minimum:

- 1. Provide a health program designed to supplement the efforts and guidance of parents/guardians to bring an awareness of regular health care on the part of students. The district shall: (a) promote good health habits among students; (b) assist in detecting and recommending treatment of medical, psychological and physical disabilities of students; and, (c) plan and administer vision and hearing screening in cooperation with the Dane County Health Department
- 2. Provide a sanitary and healthful environment in the schools.
- 3. Implement programs and services that provide for the health and welfare of students.
- 4. Expect district employees or designees to be alert to health- or safety-threatening situations. The Board does, however, recognize that in spite of such vigilance, illness and accidents do occur.

Student physical health records shall be maintained on all students and shall be released only to persons entitled to them by state law. Student physical health records shall not be maintained for a period of longer than one year after the student ceases to be enrolled in the district unless the student or the parent/guardian of a minor student gives permission that the records may be retained for a longer period of time.
