GUIDELINES FOR CLEANING CLASSROOM AND STORING CLOTHING

(Only classrooms where cases of lice are identified)

A. Classroom

- 1. Vacuum thoroughly; rugs, upholstered furniture, pillows and articles not easily washed.
- 2. Dry cleaning of some articles can be very expensive and difficult, such as dolls, teddy bears, etc. Therefore, sealing such articles in a plastic bag for two weeks at room temperature far surpasses the length of time the lice and nits can survive.
- 3. The use of insecticidal sprays is not recommended and strongly discouraged. It is expensive, of questionable benefit and may be harmful to faculty and students.
- 4. Headphones should not be used for 2 weeks after a live occurrence and should be sealed in a ziploc bag.
- B. Clothing Storage

Each child's hat and coat, art smocks and gym clothes should be stored separately from other students' clothing. This can be accomplished in any of several ways:

- 1. Assign individual lockers to students.
- 2. Assign wall hooks 12 inches or more apart to each student or put wraps in individual garbage bags (plastic grocery bags work well). Make sure children use their own bag.
- 3. Let students hang their short coats on the backs of their chairs and long coats on the coat rack spaced so they do not touch.
- 4. Let students hang all their coats on the backs of their seats.
- 5. Store caps and scarves separately, let each student store them at his/her desk or put caps and scarves in sleeves of coat.
- 6. Students wit long hair are encouraged to wear ponytails.
