## STUDENT SCHOLARSHIPS AND AWARDS

District students shall be informed annually of any available scholarships and awards.

Literature concerning available scholarships and awards shall be made available to students by the High School Guidance Counselor. Criteria for district awards and scholarships shall be developed consistent with district goals and objectives.

The High School Principal shall be responsible for ensuring that the qualifications and merits of students are carefully weighed in giving all scholarships and awards. Scholarships and awards administered by the district must have the final approval of the Superintendent. Recognition of individual recipients shall be accorded at an annual awards or graduation ceremony.

Marshall Public Schools shall not discriminate in the acceptance and administration of gifts, bequests, scholarships and other aids, benefits or services to students from private agencies, organizations or persons on the basis of sex, race, religion, national origin, color, ancestry, creed, pregnancy, marital or parental status, sexual orientation or physical, mental, emotional or learning disability or handicap. Discrimination complaints shall be processed in accordance with established procedures.
