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FOOD SERVICES MANAGEMENT

Students in the Marshall Public Schools have an opportunity to participate in school lunch and milk programs as a result of the district's participation in the National School Lunch Program. The district's participation in this program shall be administered by the Business Manager, or designee, in accordance with established guidelines.

The Business Manager shall enter into an agreement with the Department of Public Instruction (DPI) and the federal government for participation in the National School Lunch Program. As required for participation in the program, the district agrees to the following:

- 1. That a school lunch meeting federal regulations be made available for all students.
- 2. That free and reduced price lunches be offered to eligible students who apply and who meet the federal income guideline.

The Business Manager shall be responsible for the management of the school lunch program. The Business Manager may delegate specific duties in relation to the school food service programs to the Food Service Director.

Vending machines, or other alternatives, may be utilized in district schools when approved by the Superintendent.

Marshall Public Schools shall not discriminate in school-sponsored food service programs on the basis of sex, race, religion, national origin, color, ancestry, creed, pregnancy, marital or parental status, sexual orientation, age, homeless status or physical, mental, emotional or learning disability or handicap. Discrimination complaints shall be processed in accordance with established procedures.
