SERIES 800 SCHOOL-COMMUNITY RELATIONS

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PUBLIC CONDUCT ON SCHOOL PREMISES

In an effort to protect staff who are on school premises within the scope of their duties and individuals who are on school premises during a school-sponsored event or event held in accordance with the Board's public use of school facilities policy from those whose actions the Board deems improper, the Marshall Board of Education prohibits an individual who is on premises owned, leased, rented or temporarily used by the district from:

- 1. Distributing or consuming alcoholic beverages or controlled substances.
- 2. Using profane, abusive or defamatory language.
- 3. Issuing threats.
- 4. Committing violent acts or committing acts that are potentially harmful, disruptive or destructive.
- 5. Willfully interfering with or interrupting the proper order or management of a school-sponsored event or event held in accordance with the Board's public use of school facilities policy.

Any individual or group involved in any of the above acts in any way may be warned and, if necessary, be requested to leave school premises by a staff member (e.g., teacher, administrator, athletic director) or an event supervisor. If an individual or group refuses to leave school premises, local law enforcement authorities shall be called.

A school-sponsored event may be suspended until individuals or groups involved in any of the above acts are removed from school premises. Admission fee refunds shall not be issued to persons who are removed from school premises. Persons who are removed from a school-sponsored event may be prohibited from further attendance at a school-sponsored event held on school premises for a period of up to six weeks.
