2024 Updates

1st & 2nd Grade Offerings

Nutrition Services (Breakfast and/or Lunch)

FREE Breakfast and Lunch program will be offered to all children in the Marshall District Area ages 1-18* years of age prepared by the District nutrition staff, regardless if they are enrolled in summer school or not. Breakfast and lunch will be served at both the Elementary School and Early Learning Center. Middle and High School students are welcome to eat at either building. Menus will be available on the school district website. Breakfast time will be 7:35-8:05 AM and lunch will be from 11:45-12:20.

Attendance

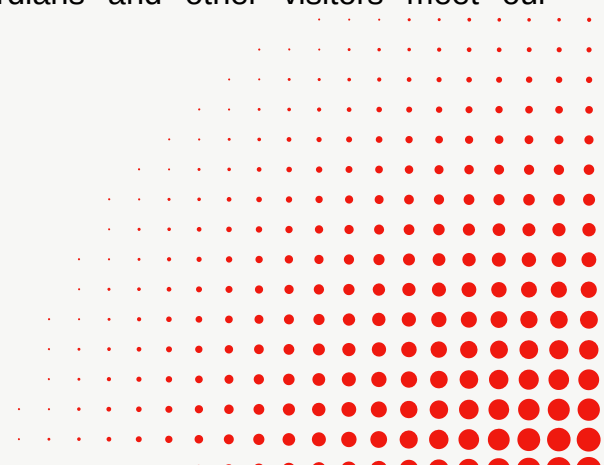
If parents/guardians know their child is going to be absent, they should call the school where their child attends and/or send a written note to the school to inform them of the absence. When a child returns from an absence, we ask that the parents send a note with the child; this ensures that we know parents/guardians are aware of their child's absence.

Transportation Service

Transportation will be offered to all students/families who live on a bus route (based on the students primary address). Students will arrive at the ES and ELC between the time of 7:35-7:50 AM so that ALL students will have the opportunity to participate in the FREE breakfast program. Students will load the bus at 12:25 PM and depart from the ELC at 12:30 PM. Bus routes will be determined by GoRiteway after the Friday, April 26th Summer School Transportation Registration Deadline that is located in Infinite Campus and communicated to families in mid-late May. Transportation will be listed as a "class" request. If students qualify for transportation, this class should be selected. Selecting transportation will NOT count against the eight class selections.

Safety

Parents/guardians who wish to visit the building or be on the playground before, during or at the end of the school day must comply with the visitor management requirements by checking into the main office of the schools upon arrival. We appreciate that all parents/guardians and other visitors meet our expectations for supporting student, staff, and visitor safety.



Online Registration

Infinite Campus Parent Portal Registration

Parents/Guardians have a parent portal associated with their children's Infinite Campus account and will submit their requests for their children's classes through Infinite Campus Parent Portal.

Parents/Guardians will need to create an Infinite Campus account if:

- They have not enrolled their children in the Marshall Public School District
- Are joining us from Parochial, Private, or Homeschool site
- Are enrolling incoming Kindergarten students who did not attend 4K through the Marshall Public School District.

Incoming 4K-Kindergarten Students

Incoming 1st grade - 8th Graders

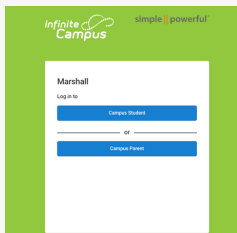
Students and parents/guardians should review classes available for selection prior to submitting requests for classes. You will register your child for classes based on their incoming grade for 2024-2025.

- Each student will have the opportunity to participate in four classes per session (8 total). When looking at the course name/description you will see "S#/P#" that refers to the session (S) and the period (P) that the class is offered (periods #1-4). You will need to select four classes (periods #1-4) from S1 and four classes from S2 (periods #1-4). This will equal 8 units, if you are participating in both sessions.
- **New this year, once a class has met it's capacity during the registration period, it will no longer be available to request on the list of available classes. Class placement is first come first serve. Please plan to register early.**
- Although we hope all students are able to enroll in the classes that are on their initial request list of eight (8) classes, you may have to enroll your student in an alternate choice as registration is first come, first served.

High School Students

HS students in need of credit recovery will be contacted by the High School and will be registered by the school. HS students interested in Advanced Fitness, EXCEL, Esports or Summer Ag Classes will register via Infinite Campus Parent Portal.

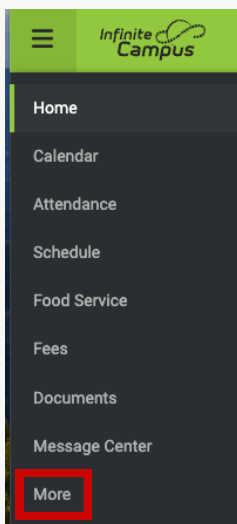
Infinite Campus - Directions

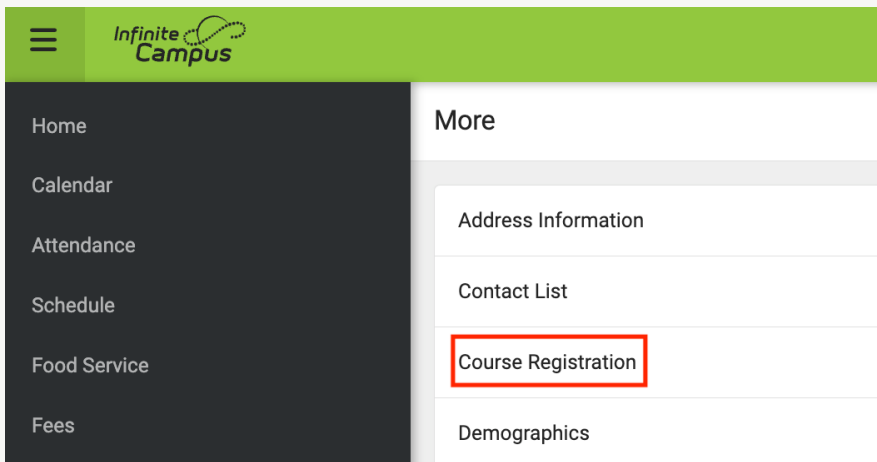

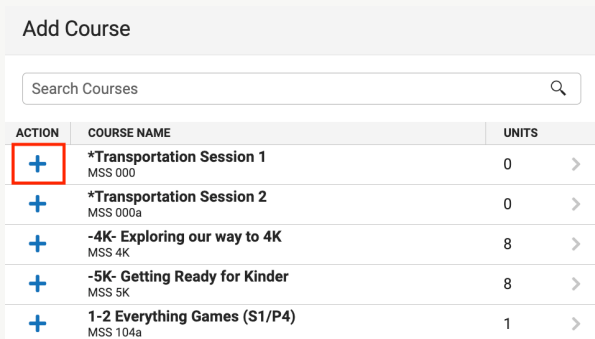

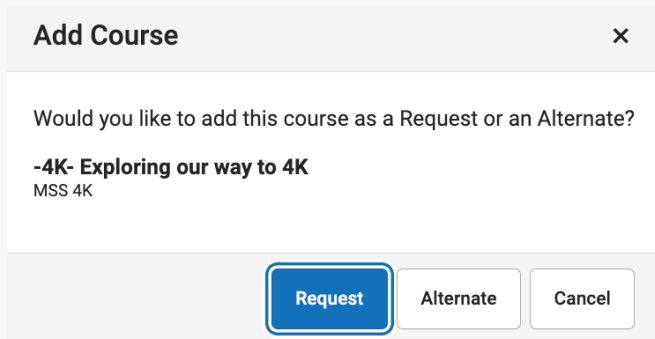


Requesting Courses:

Note:

- **Please keep grade level requirements in mind while registering your child. All grades listed are based on the incoming grade for the 2024-2025 school year**
- Courses will show up in Infinite Campus in order of Grade. ie- Frisbee Games (3-8) will be labeled 3-8 Frisbee Games, whereas Summer Band (6-8) will be labeled 6-8 Summer Band
- If you have more than one student you will repeat the registration process separately for each student
- **If you no longer see a course offered, it has filled to capacity and is no longer available**
- If you live on a bus route and are requesting transportation, please add the transportation request for all sessions you are participating in to be routed. This will not count against your eight classes
- If you would like to pick 2 “Alternate” classes, in case of class cancellation etc. please do so, but this year it is not required.

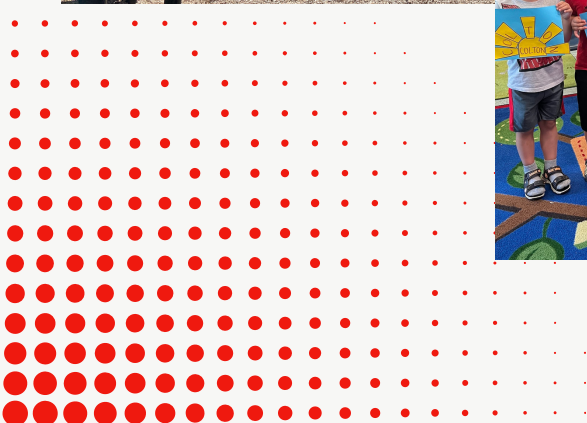
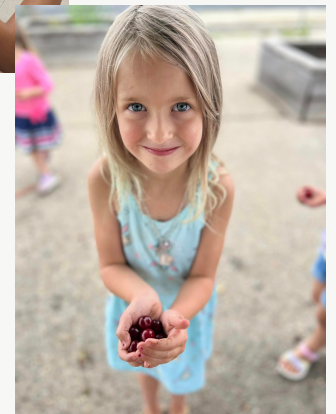

4K-K Course Descriptions

Exploring our way into 4K - Teachers - Ms. Wood, Ms. Gurgos

If your child is an incoming 4K student then this is the class for you! Over the course of the two three-week sessions we will be learning all about different animal groups, gardening, insect exploration and so much more while enjoying the summer weather! During our time together we will learn many pre-academic skills to get geared up for 4K. We will practice with scissors, coloring, working on fine motor muscles, learning how to make friends, and manage our feelings!

Getting Ready for Kindergarten - Teachers - Mrs. Blake, Ms. Showers

Welcome to Kindergarten! Students will get to know some of the kindergarten teachers, while exploring summer fun activities connected to literature. We will incorporate art, math, literacy and large motor lessons, social-emotional skills, as well as some of the routines that they will experience once they enter Kindergarten in the fall! Students who are enrolled in DLI will be placed in the DLI section of Exploring Our Way into 4K/K. The DLI section will be conducted in Spanish to help lift Spanish language development.

Exploring Our Way into 4K/5K DLI (Dual Language Immersion) - Teacher TBD

Welcome to 4K and Kindergarten! Students will get to know the ELC, while exploring summer fun activities. We will incorporate art, math, literacy and large motor lessons, social-emotional skills, as well as some of the routines that they will experience once they enter school in the fall! Students enrolling will be placed in classes based on 2024-25 class list assignments prior to the start of summer school. Students who are enrolled in DLI will be placed in this DLI section of Exploring Our Way into 4K/K. The DLI section of summer school will be conducted in Spanish to help lift Spanish language development.

1st-2nd Course Descriptions

Animals, Insects, and Gardening from Around the World - Teacher - Mr. Hassinger

Learn about interesting animals and insects from around the world through art-type activities of drawing, painting, clay, and collages. Basic gardening techniques will also be used to grow plants and flowers.

Basketball - Teacher - Ms. Diehl

Time to lace up those basketball shoes! In this awesome class we will review basketball skills like dribbling, passing, and shooting. We'll also review offensive and defensive strategies to incorporate game play!

Clay - Teacher - Ms. Parsons

Who wants to learn about clay and make your own ceramic artwork? We will be learning more about clay as well as making multiple pieces of clay. We will have the chance to glaze and paint our clay. We will focus on basic hand building skills with freedom to create your own clay artwork!

Everything Games Camp! - Teacher - Ms. Bouton

The worst part about summer is being bored. Let's change that! This class is going to introduce you to a whole variety of different games. From card games to board games and so much more. We will EXPLORE it ALL! This gives amazing opportunities for students to practice emotional regulation, following directions, turn taking, problem solving, and so much more! Come join for some fun game time with your friends!

Games, Sports, Exercises, and Activities - Teacher - Mr. Hassinger

Explore and enhance your skills of throwing, catching, and kicking through a variety of games, sports and activities. Duck duck goose, bug in the rug, tag, kick the can, steal the flag, ghost in the graveyard, and cat and mouse are just some of the games we will play both inside and outside.

Literacy Machines! - Teacher - Ms. Bouton

Need to find your reading spark? Come join the fun that comes with reading! This class offers the opportunity to revisit important literacy skills and concepts that you've learned to give you the boost for next year! We will touch on important decoding skills, interactive word work experiences, and practice engaging in texts independently through reading and writing! You will leave with a spark for reading like never before!

Little Einsteins - Teacher - Mrs. Kubiak

Are you curious about science?! This class offers the opportunity to investigate the world around you! Students will embark on an exciting journey of discovery through collaborative problem solving, interactive activities, and hands-on experiments!

Math Marvels - Teacher - Mrs. Kubiak

Do you like math and want to improve your skills? This class offers the opportunity to revisit important math concepts you already learned to give you the boost for next year! Students will use collaborative problem solving, manipulatives, and math games to build their abilities as mathematicians!

Music Fun - Teacher - Ms. Davison

Explore different types of music through various instruments, movement, singing, and other activities!

Painting - Teacher - Ms. Parsons

Artists will learn a variety of painting techniques in this class. Students will have the opportunity to make a variety of paintings with new themes each week. If you are looking to learn more about painting and have the supplies and time to be creative, sign up for this class!

Soccer - Teacher - Ms. Diehl

We're going to put all of our soccer skills like dribbling, passing, and striking together and learn more about game play like offensive and defensive strategies! If soccer is new to you, that's okay! We will learn about the basic soccer skills and knowledge!

Taste Test Kitchen - Teacher - Ms. Bouton

Come and join this fun cooking adventure where we will explore and learn all about beginning cooking skills, following directions through a recipe, and of course, tasting the delicious hard work! If you are interested, you will go home with a handmade cookbook, new knowledge and skills, and a full tummy! These will be quick and easy snacks of different varieties and students will love the autonomy and skills they get to go home and share with families. Come and join!

T-ball/Kickball - Teacher - Ms. Diehl

Have you ever wanted to join the kickball game at recess, but you don't know the rules of the game? Join my class so when it's time for recess, you know EVERYTHING about kickball! We will highlight skills and game play for kickball and T-ball! We will also explore fair and creative ways to pick teams!

Team Building/ Flag Belt Games - Teacher - Ms. Diehl

Want to be outside while learning different tag games and team games? This class is perfect for you! In this course, not only will you learn various games to play with flag belts like Capture the Flag, but also how to problem solve and communicate as a team!

3rd-8th Course Descriptions

Archery - Teacher - Mr. Springer

Have fun shooting actual bows every day. Learn basic archery shooting skills in a safe controlled environment while developing focus, self control, discipline, and patience.

Basketball for Beginners (3-5) - Teacher - Mr. Silvius

Students will learn the basic skills and rules associated with basketball while running through basketball drills and playing games to learn the rules while also improving their abilities.

Basketball Skills and Drills - Teacher - Mr. Seep

Students will learn the basic skills and rules associated with basketball while running through basketball drills and playing games to improve their abilities.

Beginning Band (Incoming 5th Grade, or 6-8 new to band) - Teacher - Ms. Gentry

Students will learn how to properly read and perform music on wind and/or percussion instruments. They will learn how to properly hold and take care of the instrument, make sounds, read music, and perform in front of their classmates. This is a great opportunity for incoming 5th grade band students to get a head start on learning their instruments for band class, or for older students looking to join band now!

Beginning Piano - Teacher - Ms. Hoggatt

Have you ever wanted to learn how to play the piano? This will be your chance to learn! 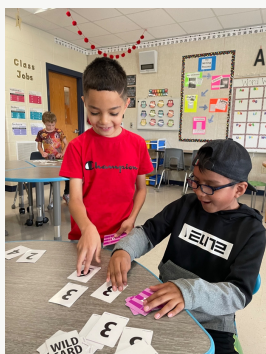
